Summer Camp Frequently Asked Questions

- What is the cost of camp per week?
(Rising K-8th Grade)
Member - \$85 a week, Non-Member \$120 a week

Financial assistance is available.

- Can a rising Kindergartner go to Camp Mountaineer?
Yes, as long as they will be enrolled in Kindergarten at the start of the school year.

- Do parents have to register for the entire summer?
No, parents can register for as many weeks and which weeks they want. We do require a two-week notice to cancel weeks due to drafting purposes. (Special circumstances may apply).

- Do parents need to pay for the entire summer?
No, the only payment due at registration is the payment for the first week of camp. We do have LIMITED slots available for 3-day a week campers on a first-come, first serve basis.

On Monday of each session an itinerary for the week will be given to each parent during rides out. Some of the larger trips will be advertised before the summer begins, but as a rule we do not announce where the field trips will be in advance.

- **What have your field trips been in the past?**

In the past we have gone to the Lazy 5 Ranch (zoo) in Mooresville, NC; Lake Lure; bowling, skating and movies. We try and plan our field trips to coincide with that camp week's theme.

- **What is Wacky Wednesday?**

Each Wednesday is our Wacky day. Camp Staff will lead the kids in wild and wacky stunts and challenges.

- **What are your drop off and pick up procedures?**

Drop off begins at 7:30 a.m. at the back of building at the gym doors and will continue until 9:00 a.m. If a parent arrives after 9:00 a.m. and the gym doors are closed they will need to BRING THE CHILD to the Welcome Center where a counselor will come and walk them upstairs.

Rides-out will begin at 5:00 p.m. at the gym doors. Prior to 5:00 p.m., parents must sign the child out at the Welcome Center and a counselor will bring them downstairs.

- **What is your visitor policy?**

We welcome parents and grandparents to come and visit us whether for lunch, games or swim time. We run Camp Mountaineer on a schedule and would hate for a parent to miss out on all the fun by coming at "quiet time", so we recommend that parents to check the daily itinerary to see what would be the best time to visit. All visitors MUST check in at the Welcome Center before visiting the camp.
